

FRUIT TREES, BUSHES & VINES

Growing fruit is rewarding to both home gardeners and commercial fruit growers alike. For the home gardener, it satisfies the desire to grow our own food providing healthy, tasty produce for our families. Commercial growers can enjoy harvesting the bounty of many improved varieties of fruit trees and berries—maximizing their profitability. Mori Nurseries carries a selection of both improved and time-honoured favourites in fruit trees (bare-root and containerized), berry shrubs and grape vines that delight the home gardener and gratify the ever-changing needs of the commercial grower.

APPLES

Selected Retail Grade Fruit Trees

Each fruit tree is hand selected at Mori Nurseries to provide our customers with the best possible plant for garden centre sales. We choose the best trees from our fields to ensure they have superior branching, symmetrical and uniform heads, and straight trunks having good caliper.

Apples are dwarf to semi-dwarf trees that grow no larger than about 5m/16' tall. Size can be controlled by pruning in very early spring. Grafting onto a semi-dwarfing rootstock affects the overall size of the plant only, not the fruit produced.

Apples are self-sterile and require a second variety for pollination. Generally any apple will pollinate another. Redcord blooms mid-season and is an excellent pollinator for most varieties. Golden Russet and Wealthy tend to be biennial and as such are poor pollinators. Jonagold and Mutsu require a third pollinator to ensure good fruit production. If flowering crabapples are in bloom at the same time, they may be used as cross-pollinators.

827	HARALSON	3	Self-sterile	early October	Medium-sized red fruit with hard, crisp and tart flesh. Good eating and cider apple. Bears fruit at a young age. May require fruit thinning. Stores well. Large dark red fruit
822	HAZEN	3	Self-sterile	late August	Large dark red fruit with juicy green-yellow flesh that is sweet but mild. Good dessert and cooking apple.
826	RED BARON	3	Self-sterile	late September	Medium-sized yellow and red fruit with crisp and juicy flesh that is sweet by mild. Good dessert and baking apple. Resistant to fireblight and bears at a young age.

739	GOLDEN DELICIOUS	4	Self-sterile	mid October	A high quality dessert apple with a yellow skin.

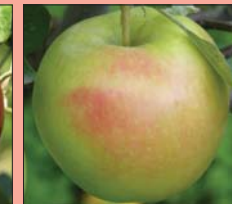

791	IDARED	5	Self-sterile	mid October	Large bright red fruit with crisp, white, slightly acidic flesh. Good dessert and cooking apple. Vigorous and heavy producer.
710	IMPERIAL GALA	4	Self-sterile	mid September	Medium-sized red and yellow apple with very juicy and sweet, crisp flesh. Needs early and adequate thinning.
768	JONAGOLD	5	Self-sterile	early October	Large yellow and red fruit with sweet and juicy, crisp cream flesh with excellent taste. Good dessert apple. Good disease resistance and easy to maintain.
776	LOBO	4	Self-sterile	mid September	Large bright red fruit with crisp, sweet flesh. Good dessert apple. Heavy producer that will benefit from fruit thinning. Developed by Agriculture Canada.
782	MCINTOSH	5	Self-sterile	September	Medium-sized red and green fruit with crisp and juicy white flesh. A good dessert apple with a short storage life.
790	MUTSU	5	Self-sterile	mid October	Large, greenish-yellow. Good for eating or baking.
792	NORTHERN SPY	4	Self-sterile	mid October	Large, bright red fruit with crisp, tart flesh. An old-time favourite dessert and baking apple. Very vigorous but slower to bear fruit than other apple varieties.
747	RED DELICIOUS RED CHIEF	5	Self-sterile	late September	Large, dark red fruit with crisp, sweet flesh. Perhaps one of the best Red Delicious. Good dessert apple. Requires fruit thinning. Good pollinizer for others.
844	SPARTAN	5	Self-sterile	early October	Medium-sized dark red McIntosh-type fruit with crisp, juicy, sweet flesh. Good dessert and baking apple. Vigorous and benefits from fruit thinning. Stores well.
806	SHAMROCK	3	Self-sterile	late September	Medium-sized fruit similar in appearance to Granny Smith. Flesh is creamy light green and firm with a flavour similar to McIntosh. Stores well. Excellent for eating and cooking.
820	TRENT	5	Self-sterile	early October	A late ripening red apple with faint striping. Cream colour, juicy flesh can be used for juices, sauces and pies or for fresh market.
864	4 IN 1	5	Self-fertile	variable	Can be any of the following varieties: Northern Spy, Red Delicious, Gala, Empire, McIntosh and Golden Delicious.

SOUR CHERRIES

Sour cherries are self-fruitful so only one tree is required to produce fruit. Sour cherries are standard-sized trees and grow approximately 4m/13' tall. Size can be controlled by pruning in very early spring. Sour cherries are primarily used for preserving, baking or sauces.

641	BALATON	5	Self-fertile	late June	Larger and firmer fruit than Montmorency that is excellent for pies and juice. Plant with other sour cherries for maximum pollination.
642	MONTMORENCY	4	Self-fruitful	late July	Large, bright red fruit with a firm texture. The most popular and widely planted sour cherry. Used for preserving or baking.
645	NORTH STAR	4	Self-fruitful	late July	Mahogany red, medium-sized soft fruit.

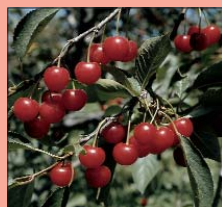

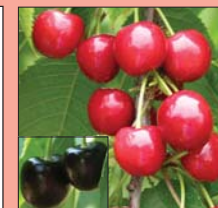
SWEET CHERRIES

Most sweet cherries are not self-fruitful so two sweet cherry varieties are required to produce fruit, except where noted. These varieties are standard-size trees and grow approximately 6m/20' tall, except where noted. Size can be controlled by pruning in very early spring.

602	BING	5	Self-sterile	mid July	Large, firm, juicy black fruit is the standard to which all others are judged. One of best known and widely planted sweet cherries.
614	CAVALIER	5	Self-sterile	mid July	A terrific black sweet cherry to open the early fresh market. Resists cracking. Very hardy.
606	HEDELINGEN	5	Self-sterile	late July	Large, firm, good quality black fruit colours before it ripens. Productive at young age.
611	LAPINS	5	Self-fruitful	late July	Very large, firm, dark red fruit. Vigorous and productive tree with upright habit.
643	NAPOLEON	5	Self-sterile	early July	Large, firm, light yellow fruit with a rose blush. Excellent for canning.
619	SANDRA ROSE	5	Self-sterile	late July	Dark red, late season. Good for eating, moderately firm.
626	STACCATO	5	Self-fruitful	early August	Fruit is large, super sweet and juicy. Late ripening, dark red to black.
608	STELLA (Natural dwarf)	5	Self-fruitful	mid July	Very large, firm, black, sweet fruit on a naturally dwarf tree. Ideal for small or restricted spaces. Self-fruitful.
618	SUMMITT	5	Self-sterile	mid July	Large, heart-shaped fruit. Juicy light red flesh.
636	TEHRANIVEE™	5	Self-fruitful	mid July	Large, firm, black fruit with good flavour. A very productive tree. Self-fruitful.
613	VAN	5	Self-sterile	early July	Fruit are similar to Bing though smaller. Pollenizes most other cherry trees.
635	VANDALAY™	5	Self-fruitful	late July	Large, firm, red fruit that is highly resistant to cracking. A very heavy producing, self-fruitful variety.
616	VEGA	5	Self-fruitful	mid July	A yellow-skinned, white-fleshed cherry with exquisite flavour. Very large in size.
624	VISTA	5	Self-sterile	early July	Widely planted cultivar with dark red, large, firm fruit.

Peaches are self-fruitful so only one tree is required to produce fruit. They grow to approximately 4m/13' tall, but can be controlled by pruning.					
530	ALLSTAR	6	Self-fruitful	late August	Bright red freestone. Stores well.
531	BLAZINGSTAR	5	Self-fruitful	mid August	Medium-sized freestone peach with firm yellow flesh. Excellent for eating.
409	BOUNTY	6	Self-fruitful	mid August	Large, firm, yellow freestone with superb flavour.
532	CORALSTAR	6	Self-fruitful	mid August	Large red freestone with superior flavour.

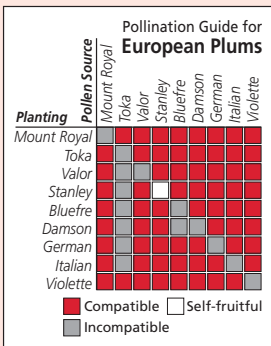

Pears are not self-fruitful so two pear varieties are required to produce fruit. These cultivars are standard-size trees and will grow approximately 6m/20' tall. Size can be controlled by pruning in very early spring. Bartlett can pollinate any Asian pear variety.					
700	ANJOU	5	Self-sterile	early October	Distinctive due to its green skin when ripe. Mild, aromatic, fine-textured flesh has a long storage life. Increased resistance to fire blight.
703	BARTLETT	4	Self-sterile	mid September	Large, golden-yellow fruit with buttery, juicy, very flavourful flesh. Vigorous grower and very productive, even at a young age.
718	BOSC	5	Self-sterile	early October	Large, green-brown fruit with smooth and flavourful flesh. A popular dessert pear, it has long storage life. Very productive tree.
721	CLAPP	4	Self-sterile	early September	Large, yellow fruit that is very similar to Bartlett, but earlier ripening. Vigorous and bears at a young age. Does well in heavy soils and is cold hardy.
725	FLEMISH BEAUTY	4	Self-sterile	late September	The hardiest cultivar for colder climates. Large, yellow fruit with fine taste. Vigorous and very productive. Must be picked as soon as they ripen.
727	GOLDEN SPICE	4	Self-sterile	early September	Smaller, golden-yellow fruit with a dull, red blush. A hardy, vigorous and very productive pear. Use for fresh eating, spicing and preserving.
704	HOSUI (ASIAN)	6	Self-fertile	mid-September	The tastiest Asian pear with juicy, sweet, refreshing flesh that is crisp like an apple. Large fruit if thinned properly (12-14 oz). Fruit stores for 3 months.
701	LUSCIOUS	4	Self-sterile	early October	Medium-sized, bright yellow fruit with a red blush and Bartlett-like taste. Sweet and juicy flesh. Superior hardiness.
706	RED BARTLETT	4	Self-sterile	mid-September	A dark, crimson red-skinned sport of Bartlett.
724	RED CLAPP	4	Self-sterile	early September	Medium-large, bright red fruit with medium firm flesh. Robust flavour.
705	SHINKO (ASIAN)	3	Self-sterile	mid October	An excellent quality, crisp pear with juicy, sweet flavour. Stores 3-4 months. A vigorous, heavy-bearing medium-sized tree. Pollinate with Hosui.

EUROPEAN AND HYBRID PLUMS

European plums are not self-fruitful, except where noted, so two different varieties of European plums are required to produce fruit. These cultivars are standard sized-trees and will grow approximately 6m/20' tall. Size can be controlled by pruning in very early spring.

654	BLUEFRE	5	Self-sterile	late September	Large, blue, freestone plum with yellow flesh. Vigorous and productive plum that bears early. Fruit thinning is beneficial to ensure large fruit.
656	DAMSON	5	Self-fruitful	mid-September	Small, blue-purple fruit. Distinctive taste commonly used to make preserves. Very productive plum. Hangs well on tree.
659	EARLY ITALIAN	4	Self-sterile	mid September	Matures 15 days earlier than regular Italian. Oblong purple fruit. Excellent flavour.
672	ELEPHANT HEART	5	Self-sterile	late August	One of the very best freestone plums. Sweet and juicy, heart-shaped fruit with red skin and flesh and superb flavour. Excellent for eating, bottling and freezing.
660	FORTUNE	5	Self-sterile	mid August	Large, red-skinned with sweet juicy flesh. Stores extremely well.
661	GERMAN	4	Self-sterile	late September	Small, dark fruit of excellent quality. Excellent for fresh eating or preserving.
665	ITALIAN PRUNE	4	Self-sterile	late September	This medium-sized blue fruit is very popular for preserving and fresh eating. Stores well.
667	MOUNT ROYAL	4	Self-fruitful	late August	Medium-sized. Blue-skinned with yellow flesh. Discovered in Montreal, Quebec.
675	STANLEY	5	Self-fruitful	mid September	Medium-sized, dark blue freestone with yellow flesh. Heavy producer.
676	TOKA	4	Self-sterile	late August	This large, purple-blue fruit has rich, juicy, yellow flesh. Use for fresh eating or for preserving. Very hardy.
677	VALOR	5	Self-sterile	mid-September	Large, deep purple-blue fruit is popular for fresh eating. Excellent quality flesh is very flavourful. Very productive freestone.
690	VIOLETTE	5	Self-sterile	mid-September	Large, oblong semi-freestone plum with yellow-green flesh.



JAPANESE PLUMS

Not self-fruitful, two different Japanese plum varieties are required to produce fruit (see chart on next page). Can not cross-pollinate European plums, with the exception of Reine Claude, which can pollinate Burbank, Early Golden and Shiro. These cultivars are standard-size trees and will grow approximately 6m/20' tall. Size can be controlled by pruning in very early spring.

691	BURBANK	5	Self-sterile	late August	Medium-sized, dark red, round fruit with juicy, aromatic flesh. A good quality, cling-stone plum, still popular after 100 years.
692	EARLY GOLDEN	5	Self-sterile	early August	Medium-sized, round, golden fruit with a red blush. Good quality, firm, freestone. The first Japanese plum to ripen. Very vigorous, it benefits from thinning.
693	OZARK PREMIER	5	Self-sterile	mid August	Bright red, tough skin. Flesh is yellow, firm, juicy and tart. Very productive.

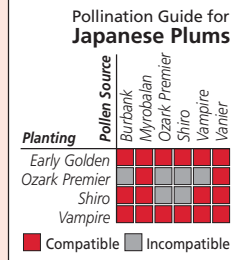

651	PIPESTONE	3	Self-sterile	early August	A "jumbo" hybrid clingstone plum, with red skin blushed with gold. Flesh is golden-yellow, sweet and juicy. Great for jams or jelly. A heavy-yielding tree.
694	SANTA ROSA	5	Self-fertile	late July	Purplish-red skin with yellow flesh. Firm, juicy and aromatic flesh.
695	SHIRO	5	Self-sterile	mid August	Round, yellow plum with a pink blush. Very juicy.
696	VANIER	5	Self-sterile	late August	Medium sized, bright red clingstone with yellow flesh. Stores well.

896	CONCORD	4	Self-fruitful	early October	Blue, seeded table juice, jelly grape. Ripens late September, early October. Moderate vigour, medium-sized clusters. Winter hardy.
898	DECHAUNAC	5	Self-fruitful	mid September	Large red grapes best suited to wine making. Very hardy.
911	FOCH	5	Self-fruitful	early September	A popular red grape for wine making. Vigorous and hardy vines.
942	LUCY KUHLMAN	4	Self-fruitful	late August	A very hardy, red wine grape.
928	MERLOT	5	Self-fruitful	mid September	A classic red Bordeaux cultivar. Very vigorous vine that creates canopied shade. Productive, with smaller bunches of grapes.
946	REISLING	5	Self-fruitful	mid October	Hardy, white grape with reliable yields. Excellent for wine making. Vigorous grower.
951	SAUVIGNON BLANC	5	Self-fruitful	mid September	A hardy, white grape that is excellent for use in wine making. A very prolific vine with high yields that will benefit from canopy pruning to maintain fruit quality.
