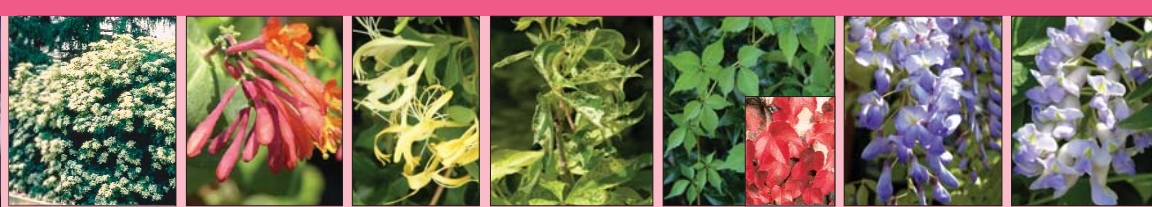


VINES

375-25	CLIMBING HYDRANGEA <i>Hydrangea anomala peteolaris</i>	4	7m 23'	White	Large lacy white flowers in clusters June-July. Glossy green leaves have yellow fall colour. Vigorous growth once established, can take two years. Self-clinging.

380-17	MANDARIN HONEYSUCKLE <i>Lonicera x brownii 'Mandarin' COPF</i>	3	6m 20'	Yellow-orange	Yellow-orange flowers and dark green glossy foliage. Vigorous grower that requires support.

385-15	STAR SHOWERS VIRGINIA CREEPER <i>Parthenocissus quinquefolia 'Star Showers'</i>	5	15m 50'	White	Green leaves are irregularly mottled with white, turn pinkish colours in cooler weather. Self-clinging.
385-20	BOSTON IVY <i>Parthenocissus tricuspidata 'Veitchii'</i>	4	20m 66'	White	Glossy olive-green leaves turn brilliant red in fall. Fast growing, self clinging.

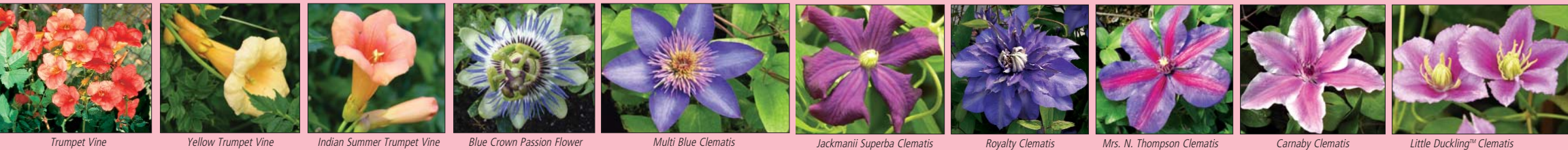

363-08	ELEGANS PORCELAIN BERRY <i>Ampelopsis brevipedunculata</i> 'Elegans'	5	6m 20'	Green	Green and white mottled leaves emerge pink-tinged. Spectacular berries of metallic purples, blues and greens. Fast growing, needs support.
363-10	DUTCHMAN'S PIPE <i>Aristolochia durior</i>	4	10m 33'	Brown-green	Flower is unusual brown-green and pipe-like. Large heart-shaped leaves. Dark red fall colour. Fast growing and does well in sun or shade.
364-09	TRUMPET VINE <i>Campsis radicans</i>	5	10m 33'	Orange-scarlet	Clusters of orange-scarlet trumpet-shaped flowers in summer. A showy, vigorous, self-clinging vine that attracts butterflies.

364-03	HERCULES AMERICAN BITTERSWEET <i>Celastrus scandens</i> 'Hercules'	3	8m 27'		Hardy, fast growing and adaptable. Required to cross pollinate 'Diane'.
383-05	BLUE CROWN PASSION FLOWER <i>Passiflora caerulea</i> Blue Crown	7	9m+ 30'+	Multi-coloured	Fragrant blue and white blooms. Leaves very tropical looking. Small orange fruit. Very fast growth must have support, can be grown on trellis or trained.
386-10	SILVERLACE VINE <i>Polygonum aubertii</i>	4	10m 33'	White	Light green heart-shaped leaves. Abundant clusters of white flowers August-September. Very fast growing vine requires support. Prune heavily each spring.

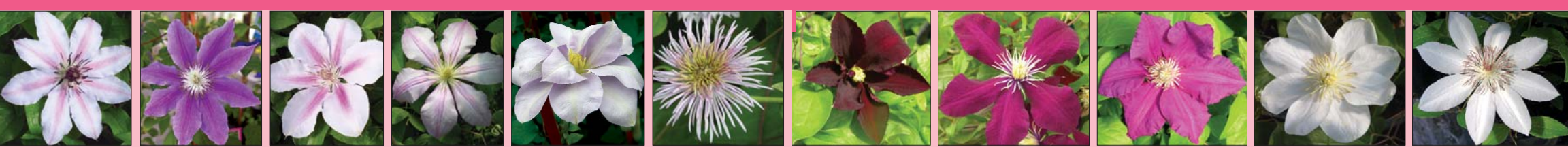
CLEMATIS PRUNING CODES

A Flowers only on previous season's growth. Prune out weak or dead stems after flowering in spring. Pruning later will result in fewer blooms.

B1 Flowers on stems hardened by previous season's growth - heavy flush in spring to early summer on last year's growth followed by a lighter flush on new growth later in season. Prune lightly in early spring to vary stem length. Remove weak or dead wood at this time. This is also good way to rejuvenate a neglected vine.

B2 Flowers both on previous and new growth at the same time, generally mid to late summer. Prune lightly in early spring to vary stem length. Remove weak or dead wood at this time. This is also good way to rejuvenate a neglected vine.

C Flowers only on current season's growth. New growth starts each year where previous growth finished. Unpruned vines will get very large, possibly out of control, and bloom only at top. Vines can be pruned at any point to control height, or allowed to scramble. To control, cut back in early spring to two sets of buds as close to ground as possible. B1 or B2 clematis can be grown at the base to hide woody stems. The best group to grow up trees or on fences.

A Flowers only on previous season's growth. Prune out weak or dead stems after flowering in spring. Pruning later will result in fewer blooms.

B1 Flowers on stems hardened by previous season's growth - heavy flush in spring to early summer on last year's growth followed by a lighter flush on new growth later in season. Prune lightly in early spring to vary stem length. Remove weak or dead wood at this time. This is also good way to rejuvenate a neglected vine.

B2 Flowers both on previous and new growth at the same time, generally mid to late summer. Prune lightly in early spring to vary stem length. Remove weak or dead wood at this time. This is also good way to rejuvenate a neglected vine.
